

ST. FERDINAND PARISH FINANCIAL REPORT 2025

Dear Friends in Christ,

As we highlight the financial activity of Saint Ferdinand Parish during Fiscal Year 2024-25 (July 1, 2024 – June 30, 2025) in the next few pages, I would like to take a moment to thank you for your generosity and ask for your help in supporting our Church and School. Your generosity has played a huge role in allowing us to maintain operations and grow our programs; however, increased costs (cost of living, utilities, repairs, etc.) in the upcoming years do create a potential challenge.

In FY25, the School celebrated its 90th Anniversary. There was much to be thankful for, and student and staff accomplishments and academic excellence were celebrated throughout the year. Safety was enhanced through the installation of a new fire panel, as well as new doors to the Activity Center. Through the EANS grant, the Cafeteria was outfitted with new tables and chairs, and new desks and chairs were acquired for the classrooms. The school year ended in June 2025 with an enrollment of 205 students, continuing the trend of steadily increasing growth throughout the years (June 2024 concluded with 181 students). The School continues this trend of success, and currently has 215 students as of January 2026.

Both the Church and the School outperformed their original FY25 budgets, as outlined in the following pages. Total revenues were higher than budgeted, while expenses were less. On the Church side, while although collections fell under budget, special donations, tuition, and Polish School's bookstore income were better than planned, thereby making up the difference. On the School side, increased enrollment and improved revenues, while EANS grant funds provided \$289,000 that was spent on textbooks, furnishings, technology, instructional support, cleaning supplies and boiler repair expenses. The EANS grant did reach its conclusion as of September 2024; any necessary operating expenses the EANS grant covered will now have to come out of school funds.

To keep our Church and School functioning and to support the various programs and initiatives that we have in place, we need your help. We rely heavily on donations from our congregation to keep our doors open, our lights on, and our programs running. Your contributions, no matter how big or small, are vital to the success of our church.

With your support, we can continue to offer meaningful worship services, provide education and outreach to the community, and offer support to those in need.

As the liturgical seasons of Lent and Easter dawn upon us and offer a time for renewal and increased almsgiving, I urge you to consider ways you can increase your financial support of St. Ferdinand Church and School and help improve our budget. Whether it is a one-time gift or increasing your weekly contributions (even by something as small as \$5 a week), your generosity will make a difference in the lives of those who call St. Ferdinand home. Together, we can ensure that our Church and School remain a beacon of hope and faith in our community. We look forward to the work that is yet to come!
